The call I received from Minister Blair Boyer was the most magnificent news one could get for our community. Some very strategic work over the last 18 months has ensured that Oakbank School is back "on the map", so to speak. We are a big part of the solution to the growth in housing and population all around the Adelaide Hills. The funding will allow us to upgrade some of the aging buildings, whilst also creating new facilities to meet the future needs of our site. We are of course in the very initial planning stages and more will be revealed over time. The increased publicity we have received from this announcement is already bearing fruit.

They love our farm and support us to ensure it can keep going well. We wish to buy a silo to allow us to purchase our chicken feed in bulk. This industry compliant silo was quoted at \$9000. Mel Welsh has diligently sold off some no longer used farm equipment for approx. \$4500. We are still looking for about another \$3500 to cover the cost. The firewood sales will hopefully cover most of this. Please encourage any family or friends to come and purchase wood from us.





Building Powerful Learners

A focus on building powerful learners and powerful learning starts with quality curriculum.

To this end, our staff all participated in an action-packed professional development day. They have all been introduced to the New SA Curriculum, with our Maths staff having a day with Dr Julia Atkin to unpack this even further. Staff learnt about the increased focus on student dispositions and capabilities — not just on knowledge. This new curriculum will be fully implemented by 2027. Daymap Connect is our Parent Portal and provides parents with secure messaging, the ability to see student assignments and attendance and school newsletters and information. Please note that the student Daymap address is different - if you see an EdPass logon page, you are on the student Daymap page.

Signing In

Each parent has their own Daymap Connect username (or Parent ID). This is usually the first four letters of your surname and two numbers. This ID is your username to access DaymapConnect. These details, or a link with them will be sent through to you via either of the processes below:



Receiving an email invitation

New parents should receive an email which has your Username (Parent **ID)** and a link to set a password. This, however, is only valid for 24 hours. The school can resend this link if you contact us either by phone or email.

Setting or Resetting a Daymap Connect Password

Alternatively, we visit the **DaymapConnect** website above and select Forgot your password? Enter the email address registered with the school and the Student ID of any one of your children attending the school (your child should know this – if not, contact the school). Select Reset password and an email invitation with your Username (Parent ID) and a link to set a password will be sent to your email.



Daymap Mobile App

Whilst the website version for Daymap works on mobile devices, the app enables easier access to messaging and student information. The web version continues to give greater functionality.



Install

To set up the **Daymap Mobile App**, visit the **web version** (see above) and click on the \equiv icon at the bottom of the screen, select **Download App** and you will be taken to your device's store.



Sign in If you are prompted to sign in when opening the app, select **Parent**, search for Oakbank School and Sign in to enter your details as above.






Grounding




National Packing Day

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
