As we move through another busy and rewarding term at Oakbank School, I continue to feel proud of the many achievements, opportunities and experiences taking place across our Reception to Year 12 community. Our students and staff have embraced learning with enthusiasm, resilience and a strong commitment to our values of Connection, Respect and Responsibility.



Rich Learning Experiences

Throughout the term, classrooms across the school have been filled with rich learning experiences, collaboration and creativity. It has been wonderful to see students engaging deeply in their learning, challenging themselves and celebrating growth and success in many different forms. From our youngest learners developing strong foundations in literacy and numeracy, through to our senior students preparing for SACE, VET and future pathways, there is a strong sense of purpose and pride evident across the school.

Celebrating Artists

I am particularly proud this term of **Daniel K** and his SACE Art teacher, **Bridie Thorp**, who, together with Curriculum SSO **Megan Crewe**, have completed outstanding work in modified SACE Creative Arts. For all our students a collaborative partnership between student, teacher, SSO and family can be the difference between just completing the required work compared to excelling in all work completed. Well done to the whole team in this learning SACE journey for Daniel. I look forward to seeing what comes next for this class.



Industry partnerships

Our primary students in years 3-6 have been invited to be participants in two exciting projects working with industry partners. They will be exploring real-life problems, using collaboration, curiosity and persistence to finding solutions to present back to the industry panel. We can't wait to see the presentations in term 3!

Beyond the Classroom

A highlight this term has also been the wide range of opportunities available beyond the classroom. Students have represented Oakbank School in sport, agriculture, leadership, wellbeing initiatives, excursions and community events. These experiences continue to play an important role in developing confidence, teamwork and belonging, while strengthening the connections between our school and the wider Adelaide Hills community.

Authentic Hands-on Agriculture Experiences

Our agriculture and sustainability programs continue to be a significant strength of the school and provide authentic, hands-on learning opportunities for students across year levels. Our barrels of Chardonnay are quietly fermenting in our wine shed under the careful watch of Milly Hoffmann and the Ag senior students. It is always pleasing to see students developing practical skills, responsibility and a strong connection to our local environment and industries. Did you know that South Australia's agribusiness, food and wine sector stands as a cornerstone of our state's economy, generating \$17.1 billion in annual revenue (PIRSA, 2025). Our students will be ready to play a part in this economic sector.

Nature Play

Our junior primary classes have been exploring our bush kindy space at the rear of the school. This allows them to use their curiosity to learn about their local environment. On Thursdays the reception class have been working with Oakbank Kindy children to support our littlest learners in their authentic nature play. Such a great opportunity!





Student Wellbeing

We have also continued our focus on student wellbeing and positive learning culture. Staff across all sub-schools work hard to ensure every student feels known, supported and challenged in their learning journey.

We continue to support our learners to understand and manage their behaviour and reactions so as to better function in the learning environment. Our work across R-12 on developing our students' skills and understanding of self and co-regulation is thriving. Ask your child tonight "**what are your preferred regulation strategies?**"

This approach has seen huge improvements, with student staying engaged in their learning in the classroom. We have seen a 47% reduction in the number of student referrals to our Supported Learning Space for 1:1 assistance and a 30% reduction in students using the Sensory Space during lesson time.

Thank you to our wellbeing and inclusion teams for the commitment to learning and wellbeing they show to students and families each day.

Building Community

Camps for Year 7 and 8 students have occurred since the last newsletter was published and I would like to acknowledge the outstanding efforts of our staff, who continue to provide engaging learning opportunities

and support students with dedication and professionalism. Their willingness to go above and beyond for students by providing school camps in their own time is deeply appreciated. We have the very exciting Year 10-12 Ski trip coming up in Term 3 as well as an inaugural trip to New Caledonia for students in Year 9-11 in Term 4. Camps are a part of the learning program from Years 3-12 at Oakbank School, providing amazing opportunities for our students.

Partnerships between school & home

Thank you also to our families and wider community for your ongoing support of Oakbank School. It was fantastic to see so many of you at our Learning Conversations (parent/teacher interviews) in week 1. If you could not take up this opportunity in week 1, I encourage you to reach out to your child's teacher/s to have a phone call about their progress and how you can support their learning at home. The strong partnerships between home and school are an important part of what makes our community so special.

As we head toward the second half of the year, we look forward to continuing to build on the positive momentum of this term, celebrating student success and creating opportunities for every learner to thrive.

Discovering the world around us through our bush learning program.



This term, our Reception students have begun an exciting new learning experience through our Bush Learning program.

Each Thursday, students rug up in their winter coats and gumboots before heading to a beautiful natural area of the school grounds behind the farm.

Bush Learning provides students with valuable hands-on experiences connected to the HaSS and Science curriculum. During these sessions, students investigate and explore the natural environment through a variety of learning activities such as wonder walks and curiosity questioning. Students are working on a STEM project to look at Nature Play across the school and have spent time collecting data and recording natural resources to develop their ideas.

Students are also encouraged to engage in nature play, developing creativity, collaboration, and problem-solving skills as they build stick cubbies, pretend fishing in the creek, search for bugs, jump in puddles, experiment with mud, and explore the environment around them.

Every second week, we also welcome students from Oakbank Kindergarten to join us for Bush Kindy. The children travel to our site on the yellow school bus and spend the day immersed in outdoor learning experiences. Bush Kindy students enjoy activities such as cooking damper over a small campfire, exploring the environment, solving problems, and making discoveries through play and observation.

It has been wonderful to see the connections forming between the kindergarten and Reception students during their shared learning sessions. These experiences provide a valuable opportunity for children to build relationships, confidence, and familiarity with the school environment, helping to support a positive transition to Oakbank School for future schooling.
